TCCW Board Meeting Minutes

December 7, 2017 • Palomino Room, Red Bluff

The meeting was called to order by President, Jeanne Smith at 6:00 p.m. Flag salute, Creed and introductions followed. Approval of Minutes: Joyce Bundy made a motion to accept the November Minutes as mailed, Laurel Walker seconded the motion, motion carried.

- Financial Report: Treasurer Renee Ewing read the Income & Expense Report for the Fashion Show of November 11. Cathy Tobin made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, Pem Lester seconded the motion, motion carried.
- Budget Report: President announced that a Budget Committee meeting will be held soon, Renee Ewing to serve on the committee.
- Correspondence: Linda Walker reported on e-mails from ANCW regarding a membership drive for ANCW and an e-mail received from Kathy Garcia regarding a request for sponsoring Temple Grandin appearance; thank you note from Kari Dodd for her CowBelle of Year award.

Committee Reports:

- Membership, Tammy Chrisler announced memberships are still coming in from the Fashion Show event. She will wait a little longer to put out Directory to catch more members. Linda Johnson, Legislative, absent. Pem Lester, Sunshine, reported no members ill. Michelle Blunkall, meeting site chair, will not be able to continue and would like to be replaced. Kendra McCluskey, Scrap Book, announced Tehama Unit placed 2nd in the Bayer contest at Convention. Beth Chaney, Scholarship announced that the Directors had voted to increase Scholarship amounts at their last meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Report of Director's Meeting: President Smith reported that Directors had voted to send Tulare Co. CattleWomen \$1,000 donation to their app for WOW THAT COW but need clarification if their goal was not met, would our donation be returned. Jeanne had learned that our contribution would be returned and Treasurer instructed to send check to Tulare Unit. "Day of Giving" donation of \$500 was approved by Directors for CSUChico Ag Department and CattleWomen received great publicity from Dave Daley, CSUC Ag Department chair and President of California Cattlemen. Directors also approved adding \$2,500 to the Scholarship program and Beef Ambassador Program and approved a \$500 sponsorship for the Region VI, ANCW meeting in Monterey in April. Shelley Macdonald agreed to complete the term of the 1st Vice Presidency but cannot be considered for President due to work-related restrictions. Charlene Priest has announced that she will be moving to Colorado and her Board position will be available as well as three other positions.
